

NEXT STOP GRUNDSCHULE!

Show your child how to behave
on the bus!

- Practice with your child: first of all let the other people get off and then get on without pushing and shoving!
- It is safer to sit on a bus than to stand. If there are no more free seats, your child needs to know how to keep tight hold!
- Teach your child the name of its stop. This also needs to be learned!
- Keep your distance at the bus stop. This is the wrong place for playing games!
- Since your child can easily be overlooked by motorists, they need to know that they must never cross the street right in front of or behind the bus! It is only once the bus has left that you can see right.

NEW STARTERS

Get to school 100% safely!

- You, the parents, need to show your children the ropes. Be a trainer for your child!
- Train before the beginning of term – lots! Practice the way to and from school!
- Look at the way to school from your child's point of view. Everything looks different from below – for instance, children cannot see entries!
- Point out the danger spots to your child!
- Explain the road traffic rules to your child. Please think: the shortest way to and from school isn't necessarily the safest!
- Adults must set a good example!

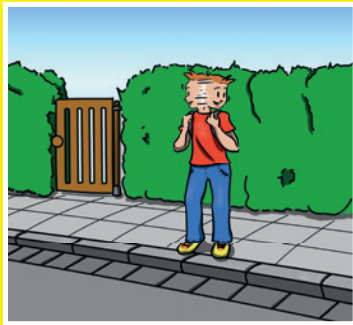
STAND – LOOK – GO

Show your child how to behave as a pedestrian!

- Practice with your child: always stop at the kerb, even if nothing is coming!
- Your child has to learn how to look left and right! Only when the coast is clear can you cross the road quickly and carefully!

Set a good example!

- Wait until all cars have come to a safe standstill!



RED AND GREEN

Show your child how to behave at traffic lights!

- Be careful when pressing the traffic light button: explain that cyclists could be passing!
- Be a good example: if the **GREEN** man lights up, first of all look to see if the coast really is clear and the cars have stopped!
- Your child must be aware that cars can also drive when it is **RED**!

ADVICE FOR CYCLISTS

Show your child how to behave on a bike!

- Children up to the age of 8 years of age must ride on the path! Suitable supervisors may also ride on the path when accompanying children. Please pay particular attention to pedestrians.
- Get off and push your bike when it comes to crossing the road!



- Wearing a helmet is a matter of course!
- Practice riding on the road with your child so that it gains confidence!

BUCKLE UP BEFORE SETTING OFF

Show your child the importance of the right child seat in the car!

- Always ensure that you and your child are correctly buckled up! Never ever forget the authorised child restraint systems in line with the child's body weight!
This also applies to short distances!
- Only ever let your child leave the car on the side of the pavement and keep some distance to the entrance to the school so that you don't endanger other pupils!
- Parent taxis cause major problems at all schools and unnecessarily endanger other children. Therefore, please let your child walk to school after you have practised the way to school beforehand.



In the first few weeks, it is better for you to accompany your child on foot instead of driving them.

This is the only way they can learn to move independently in traffic.

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
